

## Principal's Message

Tēnā koutou katoa

Ngā mihi nui kia koutou katoa - Warm greetings to you all.

As principal of Tauranga Primary School I am so proud of our learners, and our leadership, teaching and support staff team. Last week I had the privilege of watching our school choir perform at the Tauranga Primary Schools' Music Festival, they were amazing, such beautiful voices and many very talented TPS singers were given an opportunity to shine on a

professional stage. Our kapa haka group are working hard in preparation of their performance at He Paku Whakangahau, early in Term 4. We had the pleasure of presenting certificates for home reading achievements to junior school learners last week. Families are supporting learning through regular reading at home, which in turn certainly helps their child make progress. Our next big building project is inching its way forward, and hopefully this time next year the middle school will be in beautiful purpose built classes. Thanks to the huge commitment from our BOT (past and present), we are finally getting to the exciting part of realizing that work. I am very thankful to the parents who have committed so much time and energy to lead our school in their governance role. I am very appreciative of the many hours of work and dedication that goes in behind the scenes, by our TPS staff, that ensures our learners have the very best opportunities that we can provide. The core of our school vision is all about collaboration and teamwork, and there is plenty of evidence of this in practice. Together, we are learning to go places.

We have been keeping a close eye on the measles outbreak in Auckland. We are currently ensuring that our medical records for all students and staff are up to date, should we need to enact a response plan if the outbreak comes to Tauranga. The first early symptoms of measles are fever, runny nose, sore red eyes and cough, followed a few days later by a rash usually starting on the face before moving down the body.

If you think you or someone in your family may have measles, stay at home and phone your doctor to alert them of your symptoms and allow them to make arrangements to assess you safely and without infecting other people, or call Healthline on 0800 611 116 for advice. Please do not just turn up to your GP, after hours or emergency department without first phoning ahead as you could potentially infect others.

#### MEASLES FACT SHEET

Our teaching and leadership jobs for 2020 are now advertised, and can be viewed on our school website. We have our Deputy Principal position and generalist classroom teaching positions advertised.

Deciding class placements for the new year is a complex task. As well as considering numbers of children at each year level and the number of teachers we are allocated, we need to consider the individual learning needs for each child, gender balance, social skill development and peer relationships. We must ensure that all learners' needs receive due consideration. Where necessary staff will discuss the placement of some children with their parents.

Most children in Years 3 and 5 will remain in the same learning hub they are in this year. We do this to maximize their learning opportunities, and reduce lost learning time as a result of transition. The year 3 to 6 teachers in each learning hub know their learners; their strengths and next learning steps, and are able to continue with current learning goals from day one of 2020.

Please note that one or two teachers may change class or year level due to normal annual staffing changes e.g. career progression. In 2020, due to large student numbers in our 2019 Year 4 cohort, we will reduce back to five x Year 3 and 4 whanau groups, and one x Year 4 and 5 whanau group, and continue with five x year 5 and 6 whanau groups

While we ask parents to allow us to exercise our professional judgement in placing all children fairly, we do appreciate some input from families where <u>specific needs</u> should be considered. It is not possible for senior staff to meet with all parents and listen to individual

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requests. However, if there are <u>extenuating or special circumstances</u> that we may not be aware of, please put these requests in writing and deliver to the Principal by the <u>end of Week 2</u> <u>Term 4, 25th October.</u>

If there has been an issue in the past that we need to be reminded of, it is also worth dropping us a note or talking to your child's class teacher, as not all information is carried over from year to year

Only requests made in writing will be considered

#### Help our children get home safely:

To try to reduce the congestion after school we are trialling a 2:50pm optional pick up time for Year 1 students (rooms 15, 16 17,18 and 19). We hope this earlier pick up traffic can park, pick up children and be gone by 3:00pm to allow parents of other children to pick up from 3:00pm. We aim to have all children collected by 3:10pm each day. If you have older, more confident, children you might consider a 3:05pm pick up, this will ensure you get a park closer to school and also help reduce the congestion at our school gate. 5th Avenue and Arundel Street do have car parks available from 3:05pm onwards.

### A winter reminder


